was chesnut colour, as were also the throat and the upper part of the body; a stripe of the same colour passes underneath the breast; the belly is of a reddish brown; the feet are covered with feathers, as well as the toes.

THE COLLARED SCREECH OWL.

WE are indebted to Levaillant for the figure and the description of a new species of screech owl, which is very rare, and which is found at Surinam. Its size is very large, and forms a medium between that of the small horned owl and the owlet. Nothing is more remarkable in this bird than two large white stripes. and its white throat; this plumage is deeply furrowed by a light brown colour, which surrounds the eyes, covers the top of the head, and encircles the breast with a large collar. All the upper part of the body is of the same colour; but the feathers are edged with white, with transversal stripes of the same colour; the belly, the rump, and the anus, are white; greyish stripes run across
