But even should we refuse this idea of penetration, we cannot deny that the liquor of the female, which flows from the glandular bodies of the testicles, may enter by the opening at the extremity of the trunk, as that of the male does by the orifice of the viscera ; and that consequently these two liquors may mix of themselves in this cavity, and form there the foetus in the manner we have explained.

CHAPTER IX.

OF THE EXPANSION, GROWTH, AND DELIVERY OF THE FŒTUS, &c.

IN the expansion of the foetus, two different degrees of growth make different kinds of expansion. The first, which succeeds immediately after the formation of the foetus, is
