2. M. SPONGIOSA, aperture of the cells with several long setæ. Robert Brown.*

Flustra spongiosa, Templeton, in Mag. Nat. Hist. ix. 469.

Hab, "Found by Robert Brown, Esq. on the coast of Ballycastle," Templeton.

"Allied to the preceeding: the mouths of the cells with several long setæ. In pilosa the mouths of the cells are surrounded by several very short teeth, with only one hair-like appendage. In this species the teeth appear lengthened into long setaceous bristles." Templeton.
