

LIGN. 137. THE LOWER JAW OF AN IGUANA.

- Fig. 1.—The right branch of the lower jaw of an IGUANA, from Barbadoes, viewed on its inner aspect: nat.
 - a. Dentary bone.
 - b. Opercular bone.
 - c. Complementary bone.
 - d. Surangular bone.
 - e. Angular bone.
 - f. Articular bone.
 - 2.—The external aspect of the same.
 - 3.—Inner aspect of three teeth (magnified) attached to the alveolar parapet; with the germ of a successional tooth at the base of the middle tooth; and the sockets of other germs at the bases of the two fully formed teeth.
 - 4. External view of the crowns of three teeth; slightly magnified.
