

LIGN. 142. TOOTH OF THE IGUANODON: nat. Tilgate Forest.

- Fig. 1.—Front aspect, showing the longitudinal ridges, and denticulated margins of the crown of the tooth.
 - 2.-View of the back, or inner surface of the tooth,
 - a. The denticulated margin.
 - b. The apex of the crown, worn by use; b. fig. 2, shows the oblique smooth surface produced by mastication.
 - c. A transverse fracture of the fang, showing a section of the medullary cavity occupied by the ossified remains of the pulp.
 - d. Marks the inferior limit of the denticulated margin; if a line were carried horizontally from d, across the tooth, the under figure would represent a tooth worn down below the denticulations, and deprived of its peculiar dental characters; in this state the tooth somewhat resembles an incisor of a Rhinoceros.
