

show the same as to a less common species. Figs. 352 and 353 show a somewhat different species. Figs. 354 and 355 represent a not unusual species, almost exactly spherical. Fig. 356 is similar but elongated. Fig. 357 shows a single carpel. Figs. 358 and 359 exhibit specimens with the apex quite aside from the geometrical axis. Figs. 360 and 361 have longitudinal ridges quite prominent. Figs. 362, 363 and 364 are more or less triquetrous. Figs. 365 and 366 are elongated, slightly striated, small fruits, with a rather thick epicarp. Figs. 367, 368 and 369 are leguminous seeds. Fig. 370 is an elegant and frail seed, with delicate waving striæ.
