

comparatively fertile, however, in the club-mosses. One of the largest and finest of the species, *Lycopodium clavatum*, with its long scaly stems and upright spikes of lighter green, —altogether a graceful though flowerless plant, which the herd-boy learns to select from among its fellows, and to bind round his cap,—goes trailing on the drier spots for many feet over the soil ; while at the edge of trickling runnel or marshy hollow, a smaller and less hardy species, *Lycopodium*
