


Fig. 131.—Perna Mulleti. One-quarter natural size. a, exterior ; b, part of the upper hinge.

are the principal. Among the Acephala, one of the largest and most abundant shells of the lower Néocomian, as displayed in the Atherfield section, is the large *Perna Mulleti* (Fig. 131).




Fig. 132.-Hamites. One-third natural size.
