cases the whole skeleton consists of only one flinty star, and is then generally composed of twenty staves, distributed according to definite mathematical laws, and united in a




Fig. 13.—Cyrtidosphara echinoides, 400 times enlarged. c. Globular central capsule. s. Basket-work of the perforated flinty shell. a. Radial spikes, which radiate from the latter. p. The pseudo-feet radiating from the mucous covering surrounding the central capsule. l. Yellow globular cells, scattered between the latter, containing grains of starch.
