

loid races into Asia? What relations do they or either of them sustain to the Australians—leathery skinned and curly-haired; to the Papuans—black and tuft-haired; to the Hot-tentots—coffee-colored and kinky-haired; to the Negroes—ebony-black and woolly-haired? What is the relative rank of these several races? When did they severally begin to exist? Where did the first men appear? Who was Adam? Are all these peoples descended from Adam? These are interesting questions which strike us at this point, and are worthy of study; but I do not regard it expedient to enter upon them at the present time. The reader who may desire to see what can be said about them, may consult “Preadamites; or, a Demonstration of the Existence of Men before Adam”—a work which is essentially a commentary on portions of Genesis and a vindication of Biblical ethnography.
