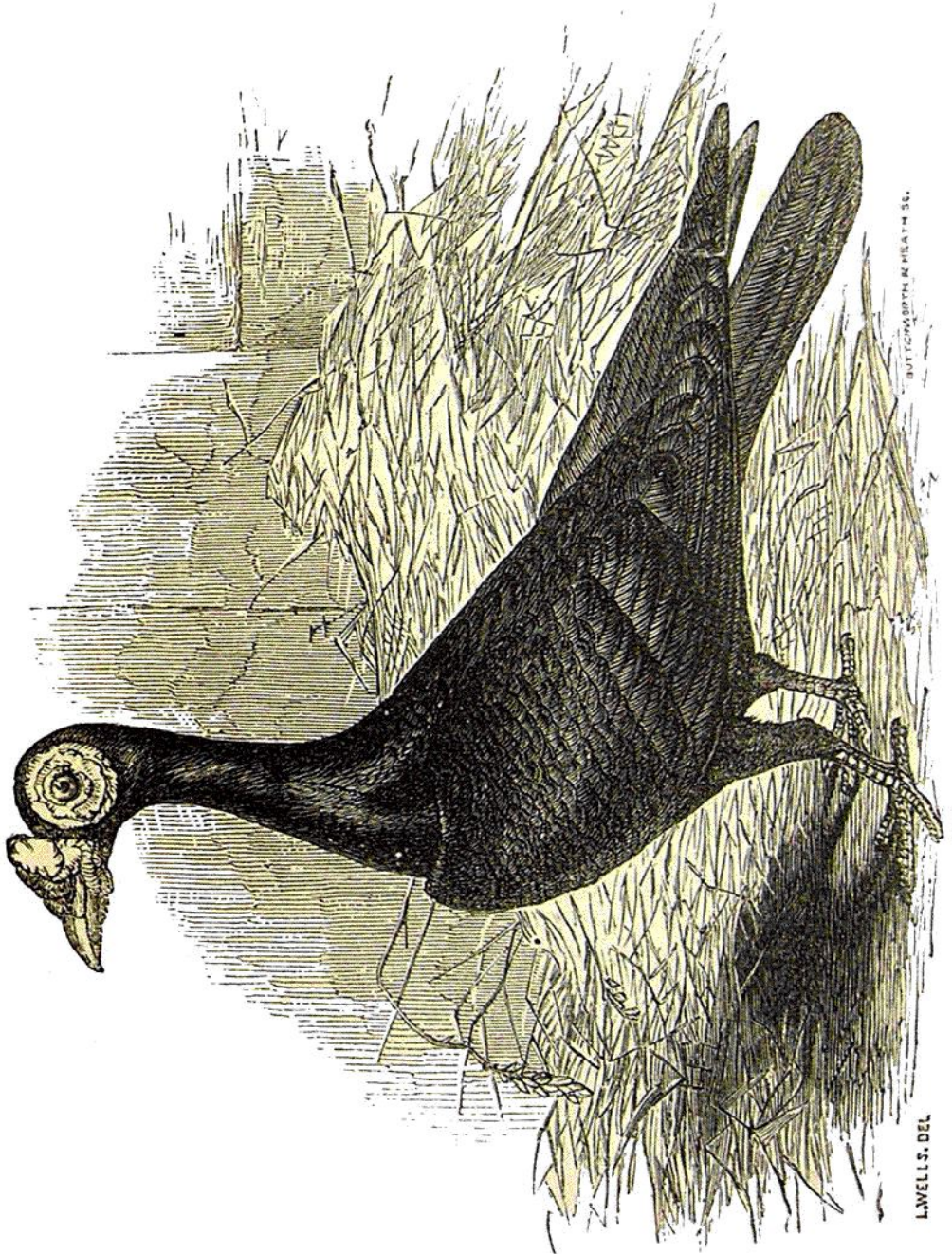


Fig. 19.—English Carrier.
