The following sub-breeds agree in having a crest, more or less developed, with the comb, when present, of crescentic shape. The skull presents nearly the same remarkable peculiarities of structure as in the true Polish fowl.

Sub-breed (a) Sultans.—A Turkish breed, resembling white Polish fowls with a large crest and beard with short and well-

teathered legs. The tail is furnished with additional sickle feathers Do not incubate.2

Sub-breed (b) Pturmigans.—An inferior breed closely allied to
