
lachian region of east Tennessee; and other flexures in this part of the region are overthrust in the same way. In the western half of the disturbed belt Silurian and Devonian strata occur, and there is one fault in which the thrust is westward. Similar facts and sections are reported by Dawson from the country just south, between the parallels of 51° and 49°.
