are known sometimes to lead to the formation of lactic acid, CH₃·CHOH·COOH, methylglyoxal, CH₃·CO·CHO, and formaldehyde, H·CHO. Further, as Neff has shown, many other substances may also be formed. Such bodies chiefly belong to the class of oxyacids. It is also certain that a great variety of other simple sugars resembling glucose, levulose,
