tacula are widely displayed; but no sooner have they felt the prey than they instantly contract, envelope it in their joint embrace, and carry it to the mouth by an involution of the whole marginal circumference. I have found that the glands with which the tentacula are tipped perform the office of suckers, as Lamarck conjectured, and thus retain their captives with greater certainty; but if Dr Fleming's figure of L. fascicularis is correct, its tentacula are not glanduliferous.
