

Stonesfield Slate.

TENIOPTERIS (wreathed fern). Leaves simple, entire, straight, with parallel margins, traversed by a strong midrib, which extends to the apex; secondary veins, simple or bifurcated at their base, and almost perpendicular to the median vein. These ferns closely resemble some species of Polypodium. Three species are known; two from the oolite, and one from a tertiary deposit. The specimen figured is a fragment.
