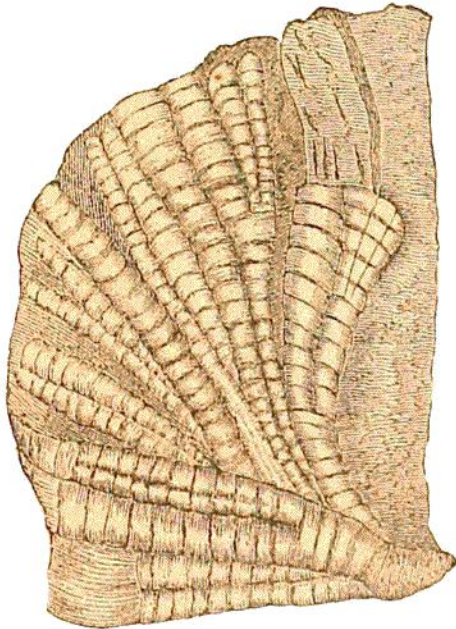

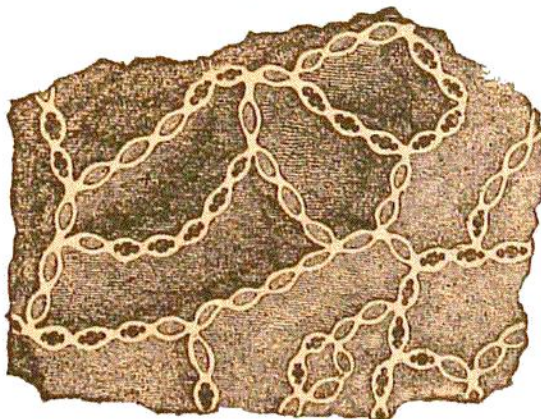
*Halysites labyrinthica.*
