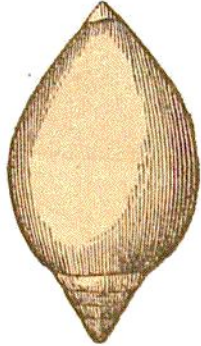
*Glandulina pygmœa.*

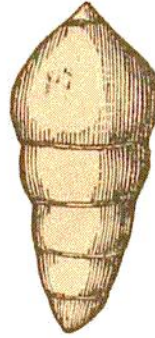
*Glandulina manifesta.*

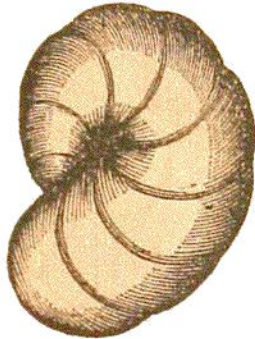
*Nodosaria proboscidea*

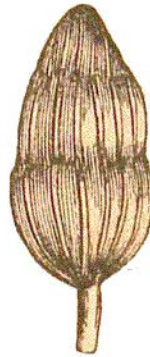
*Cristellaria Spacholtzi.*

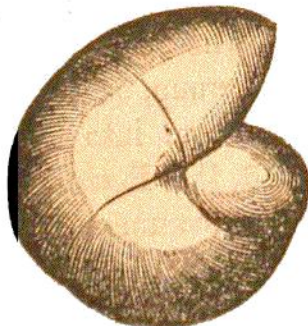
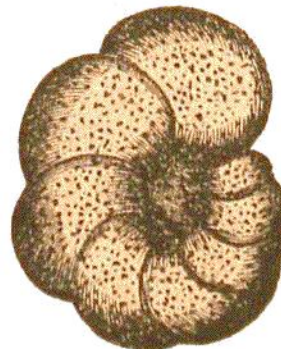
*Nonionina quaternia*
