History in Paris, where anybody may see them, should ever have been mistaken, for a single moment, for human remains. The skeleton of Teutobocchus remained at Bordeaux till 1832, when it




Fig. 166.—Skeleton of Mesopithecus.




Fig. 167.—Mesopithecus restored. One-fifth natural size.

was sent to the Museum of Natural History in Paris, where M. de Blainville declared that it belonged to a Mastodon.
