
It is readily distinguished from the Diploria by the ridges between the furrows, these being simple and triangular.

Still other forms of the Astræa tribe are foliaceous, or such as would result if the growing margin of an Astræa, or of a Meandrina, were to spread out into folia instead of thickening

upward in the ordinary way. The groups of gracefully curving leaves thus made are sometimes very large and symmetrical.

2. Fungia tribe, or FUNGACEA.—The general character of the simple species of this tribe is mentioned on page 25, and the character of the living Fungia, with its tentacles, is shown in the figure of a Feejee species on page 26. The corallum of another large species, the Fungia Dana, is represented
