I also take this opportunity of conveying my best thanks to my friend and colleague, Mr. Children, of the British Museum, for his kind assistance, in revising the sheets while the work was printing, and for his many valuable suggestions during its progress through the press.

A catalogue of the wood engravings has been subjoined; and also a tabular view of the classification of animals adopted by Cuvier in his "Regne Animal," with familiar examples of animals included under each division; both of which I conceived might prove useful for purposes of reference. The latter table is reprinted from that which I have given in my "Introductory Lecture on Human and Comparative Physiology," published in 1826, with only such alterations as were required to make it correspond with the second and improved edition of Cuvier's work.
